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LINEA DE FUEGO BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
DECEMBER 8, 1993

PRESENT: Marc Halcon, Bill Hamilton, Larry Polzin, Al Bauder,
Pattie Thrapp, Bob Smith, Gene Welch, George Conger,
Shirley Hamilton.

1. Meeting called to order at 7:30 p.m. and minutes of last board meeting were approved.
2. Rainbow: Andy McIntosh will be the match director for 1993 with Bruce Hanck and J.R. Abel assisting when they can. We are looking into the possibility of a shed. Bill Anthony is trying to arrange for one. Rainbow would own it and have access to it (that is, would have a key in case MD forgot his/hers). Fee structure - why do Rainbow members rather than LDF members get a break? Pattie will talk to Bill Anthony. Use of shotgun range - if wish to use the shotgun range need to send a letter to Bill Anthony re: use. We might want to wait until Andy has run a few matches before we expand.
3. LDF Logo: It was noted that Bill Hahn was the originator of the first LDF logo. Board requests that permission for use in writing be obtained before anyone -match directors included- use the logo on shirts etc. This way the Board will know whats going on. MD'S etc will need to also be sure shirt company's are aware that the logo is ours and should not be used without permission.
4. Classification system: Shooter's Emporium will host a Limited Match on the second Sunday of each month. It will be restricted to only limited guns. If open class guns are used the score will not count. It will be "just for fun". Our usual "Trophy Chase" will be from open matches. A separate trophy chase will be held for the Limited Club. This FY the Limited Chase will start in November, 1992 (the first match held) and end May 31, 1993. Four of the twelve matches will have to be shot for a shooter to be considered in the "Chase". The limit of four will work also in this first short year since there will be 7 matches possible between November and May. Limited National slots will go through the Limited Club first.

LDF vs USPSA ranking: A great deal of discussion ensued. A motion was made, seconded and passed to: drop LDF class in favor of USPSA class. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to: use whatever USPSA class the shooter has June 1 through March 31. This will allow any change in classification issued by USPSA. After March 31, the club will "freeze" the shooter's class for purposes of the "Trophy Chase" at whatever class the shooter was in on March

31. Any change in class between April 1 and May 31 would become effective in the new fiscal year on June 1. Unclassified shooters will get the highest class they achieve during their first year and then will follow the above pattern. This is effective January 1, 1993.

Old Business: Match directors/2-Day MD

5. Match directors are members of the Executive Committee, but what about the 2-Day MD? A motion was made, seconded, and passed to: have the 2-Day MD be appointed by the President and approved by the BOD, at which time he/she will become a member of the Executive Committee and will receive one vote with the understanding that the person will have committed to running the 2-Day by September 30. The 2-Day MD will continue to hold his position until the BOD is informed otherwise (e.g. the person resigns) OR a new MD is appointed OR September 30 following the match.
6. Meetings: BOD

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to meet every four months. The BOD/EC will be notified at least 30 days in advance.
7. By-Laws are ready and will be mailed out, probably in the newsletter. BOD and members are asked to submit any comments, suggestions etc. to the BOD.

New Business

8. 3-Gun Match will be held Jan 30-31, 1993 at Lemon Grove R&G Club. Probably 50 will show up. Trophies and engraving are being checked into for best price. Rifle plates have been bought. It was suggested to use "time-only" scoring and Bianchi targets. MD Al Bauder will try hard to stay within amount of money brought in. CRO's will be on the stages and an RO/Squad Leader will be assigned to each squad. Ro's will get a break. The BBQ will be on Sat. and Alpine Meats is the vendor.
- 8a. Kerry Standifer and Andy McIntosh want to hold a rifle match after LGR&GC IPSC match. They need to bring courses of fire, outline of what want to do, charges if any to the board.
9. We now have 48 matches shooters are able to attend. Does LDF want to increase the minimum required number of matches shot for the "Trophy Chase"? NO. Number stands at 15.
10. 2-Day Match

What do we want to do? Maintain as Sectional Championship with USPSA sanction, getting mission count. BOD agreed that will continue as before. Budget needs to be set up. "Break even" or "make money"? BOD realizes that match may go over "budget". We don't usually set it up to make money, though. Courses of fire need to be submitted to George Conger. Designer must be willing to set-up and run the course. A suggestion was to run the MD's, CRO's, and Stats through the match on the Friday before. this would help work out any bugs, but requires that match be set up on Thursday.

11. Norco has opened a new range with 12 bays. May ask for Area II Championship to be help there. LDF, SWPL, Oakland are being asked to take up a stage to run, probably in 1994.
12. Team Competition: year-long tracking impossible to do. Individual MD's can do teams if want.
13. Stats Officer

A new stats officer is needed. Bob Smith is officially resigning on May 31, 1993. To help wear-and-tear on the stats officer, all MD's will get a box with timers, score cards, etc so that they can be responsible for the setting up and scoring of their matches. This will decentralize stats. Also we will need someone to be the newslette editor as Bob does this also. MD's will need to meet with Bob for information on the scoring program and submission of classifier scores.

Steel: Andy mentioned that he wants more steel. It was decided that MD's should put together a list of what they want and submit to the BOD.

Toy Drive: A toy drive will be held for Children's Hospital during November and December.

Clean Ranges: All ranges to be cleaned before LDF leaves. This is getting us into trouble with a number of the ranges (LGR&GC esp). To aid in this, it was suggested that we use target TAPE rather than PASTERS. Tape is also cheaper.

Stage for Area II Championship: LDF was invited to design a stage for April 94. Ron Pearson, George Conger and Larry Polkin are in charge. It will be based on the Wizard of Oz.

Joe Bridgman was appointed Treasurer at the annual club meeting on May 20, 2000 by the outgoing President, Steve Arnold. On July 7, 2000, the savings and checking accounts were closed out at Bank of America and opened at San Diego Municipal Credit Union.

The Championship Account, which was used solely for the funding of the annual Sectional/Championship Match, was closed and put into the LDF Savings account at the Credit Union. As the 2001 Championship Match got closer, a Championship checking account was opened on 1-9-01 with \$1000.00 from the LDF savings account. As entry fees came in, that \$1000.00 was paid back to the LDF savings and the Championship account was self-sufficient from that point on. After this years match is over and all bills paid, \$1500 will be left in the Championship account to avoid service charges and the remaining funds will be transferred to the LDF savings account.

The savings account at Bank of America was earning 1.00 % interest and at the Credit Union will now earn 2.75 % if the balance is kept over \$100.00. The checking accounts earned .25 % at Bank of America and will now earn 1.75 % and will only have a service charge of \$1.00 if the balance goes below \$1500.00 at the Credit Union.

The CD's were earning 5.45 % interest at B of A and will now earn 6.01 % at the Credit Union.
